Explain the One Health concept and its relevance for legal reasoning across human, animal and environmental health. 2. Differentiate between key legal domains involved in One Health governance (e.g., medical law, public health law, veterinary law, environmental law, food law, pharmaceutical law). 3. Identify and interpret core international and regional legal frameworks relevant to pandemic prevention, preparedness and response, including One Health-related obligations and policy directions. 4. Analyse how public authorities may lawfully manage health risks using regulatory tools such as surveillance, reporting duties, emergency measures and risk communication, while respecting fundamental rights. 5. Assess the legal and ethical tensions between individual rights (autonomy, privacy, freedom of movement) and population-level health protection (necessity, proportionality, solidarity). 6. Apply One Health reasoning to real-life scenarios (e.g., zoonotic outbreaks, antimicrobial resistance, food safety incidents, environmental contamination) and propose legally sound responses.

	7. Evaluate institutional competences and interagency coordination needs (health, veterinary, environmental, food safety, crisis management) from a governance perspective. 8. Collaborate effectively in interdisciplinary and international teams, demonstrating communication skills across different professional and cultural perspectives. 9. Produce a concise written policy brief or case analysis addressing a One Health problem, with clear legal justification and practical recommendations.
